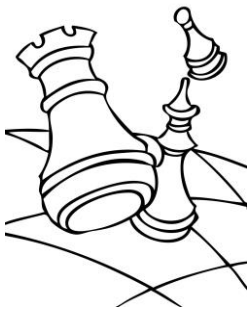

## IMPORTANT ACTIVITIES INFORMATION

Within this booklet you will find information which details the Autumn Term's co-curricular activities for all pupils. Do please read the information carefully so that you are able to make the correct choices for your daughter. You will notice that some clubs run before school, some after school and some during lunchtimes. As children progress through the school year and indeed through the school, the range of activities expands. For Reception Children we will allocate a maximum of two clubs. In addition, the types of activity on offer each term may change slightly.

You can apply for places by signing up to the Virtual Activities Environment. This can be accessed by visiting the 'Co-Curriculum' page of the school website, [www.warwickprep.com](http://www.warwickprep.com). Please click on the link on the page [www.warwickprep.com/thistermsactivities](http://www.warwickprep.com/thistermsactivities). You will already have log-in credentials for your child/ren. If you are unable to remember your login details, you can reset these on the front page of the VAE (<http://mychq.net/warwickprep>). There is no need to contact the school office to reset your details.

The booking page will open for sign-up on **Monday 1 July at 6.00pm and will close on Wednesday 3 July at 10.00am.** Unfortunately we **cannot accept any activity requests after this deadline** so please do book in during this sign-up period.

We aim to ensure that clubs and activity places are allocated as fairly as possible and wherever we are able to, we allocate all children to their first choice activity at least. Please rest assured, there is a measured and logical approach to the allocation of places and we ask all parents to respect this and therefore the final decisions that are made.

If you select two simultaneous activities through the Virtual Activities Environment we will automatically allocate a place in the club with the higher preference number, unless of course the club is oversubscribed. In addition, if your daughter has instrumental tuition in school, individual music lessons **cannot** be moved in order to accommodate activity requests. Should your daughter's individual music lesson be set and clash with an activity choice, the time of the instrumental music lesson will take priority and the allocated place in the activity will be withdrawn (no charge will be made). For the next term, the time of instrumental lessons is not yet confirmed (you will hear about lesson times in due course).

Some activities and clubs run on more than one occasion to enable maximum participation.

Information about the activities is listed on the following pages, starting with before school activities, then lunchtime clubs and finally, after school activities.

Attendance at many of the musical activities is by invitation. For the Autumn Term, some activity places have been allocated by invitation. However, those that are open to sign up will show in the VAE accordingly. If your daughter's attendance at an activity has been marked by green tick, this is an invitation. If she wishes to withdraw from an invited activity, **you cannot do this at the time of requesting activities**, so instead should contact me directly on ([a.crafts@warwickprep.com](mailto:a.crafts@warwickprep.com)) to withdraw. If, on the other hand, your daughter has not previously attended a musical activity but is interested in doing so, you will be able to indicate this in your preferences where clubs are open for new participants. Any requests to join a musical activity will be passed on to the Miss Griggs, Director of Music - if it is appropriate for your daughter to join an activity, you will be notified of this once we confirm all of the places before the Summer holiday. If your daughter is not able to join the requested musical activity your confirmation email will indicate 'place declined'. Should you seek further information, please contact the Music department, though it is most likely that your daughter is not of the required standard for the group or the current pupils in the group are a long way down the line in their training or rehearsal.

The cost of all activities will be added to your end of Autumn Term fee account; no payment should be sent to school. By requesting a place, you are committing to payment should a place be allocated. The majority of after school activities run from 4.00-5.00pm. However, there are some exceptions to the timings, but these are all clearly listed in this booklet. Where an activity starts at 4.45pm or later, girls are supervised in school and given a light tea (this is included in the cost of the activity). The cost will be shown on your end of term bill as separate charges, one for the activity and an after school charge.

For an additional £3.90, children can be booked into After School Care at the end of an activity; this includes a light tea. Parents who require before *and* after club care will only be charged £3.90 once (inclusive of tea). ASC bookings should be made through the VAE.

When girls are involved in planned educational visits or we are aware in advance of dates when clubs or activities cannot run (for example if the Main Hall is in use for another event), no charge will be made to parents. However, we are unable to reimburse parents if their daughter is chosen to represent the school in a fixture and the match clashes with a paid activity.

It is anticipated that parents will be notified of the activity places allocated to their child before the end of the Summer Term. Activities will be confirmed via an email generated by the VAE as normal.

All activities will commence from Wednesday 4 September and the last week for most activities will be the week commencing Monday 10 December. There are a few exceptions though and these will be clearly listed on the printed and electronic calendars when these are published. Once activity places are confirmed, you may also log into the VAE where all session dates / cancellations for your child's activities will be listed.

*Parents should note that whilst we endeavour to provide some consistency to the type of activities we offer, we do not guarantee to run any club indefinitely or as part of a wider course. Similarly, we may need to change the day on which an activity or club is offered from term to term, in order to ensure a good spread of activities for pupils or for provider convenience.*

Children should come into school through the Banbury Road Office and Miss Carvell will meet them there.

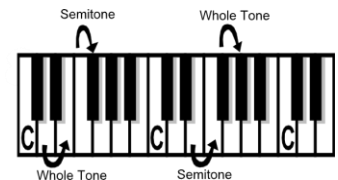
**Specific activity information:** A trial will be held at the end of this Summer term within the Year One PE lessons for those wishing to join the Gym Squad. Selected children will be invited to attend in order to develop more advanced skills, learn individual floor routines choreographed by Miss Carvell, vaults and to prepare for future competitions.

#### Specific activity information:

This activity is for girls who are Grade 2 and above in their music performance. Girls who have been attending music theory lessons during the last academic year are expected to continue. Pupils who are working at a lower level in their instrumental tuition cover basic music theory in their normal instrumental lesson. The sessions are for pupils who learn musical instruments either inside or outside of school. Parents of pupils who wish to take Music Theory should book into one of the four sessions, once other activity places have been selected. In theory (no pun!), all children who need to, should be able to choose one of the sessions!

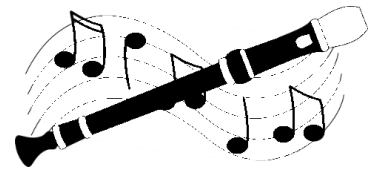

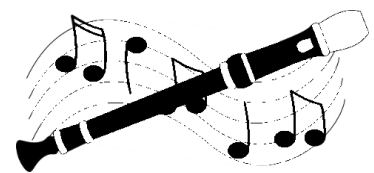


### **Specific activity information:**

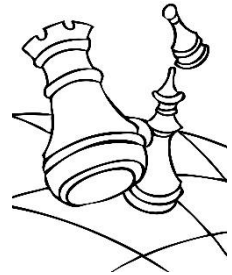

#### Specific activity information:

Mr Thomas, a former British Under 21 Chess Champion and World Chess Federation (FIDE) Chess Master, runs and oversees all our chess tuition. He is a certified English Chess Federation chess coach who teaches through a structured syllabus incorporating the Chess Rocks certification scheme. The sessions are a mixture of coaching, free play and competitions.

Chess is a fabulous game and research shows that studying the game is a great way to improve a child's concentration, problem solving abilities and social skills. Fees include all competition / ladder prizes, Chess Rocks examination and certification fees and mascots & badges etc. given throughout the year as incentives.

Complete beginners are welcome, as are those who already have experience of playing the game.

It now has 50,000 boys and girls enjoying classes each week across 14 countries!

The classes are led by coaches who are committed to ensuring that all of the children are engaged and developing skills and confidence in a lively fun environment whilst delivering classes with energy, excitement, imagination and enthusiasm.

The classes are tailored to particular age groups to ensure the children get the most possible from them. The fun, structured play sessions take children on a journey of sporting imagination with engaging and energetic coaches supporting them every step of the way whilst teaching how to catch, pass, kick, run with the ball and play as part of a team. As well as this it enables children to learn about respect, discipline, team work and helping others, all skills that are so important as they grow and develop.

This activity will run outside, throughout the term, come rain or shine. Please ensure your child therefore has appropriate clothing. There is no indoor provision. Parents who withdraw their child from a session, if the weather is bad, will not receive a reimbursement.

**Clothing:**

Pupils should wear their normal school PE kit. As the activity will take place outside, children should ensure they always have their Warwick Prep sun cap in school in order to protect themselves in the warmer weather. Similarly, fleeces and gloves can be worn when the weather is cold.
