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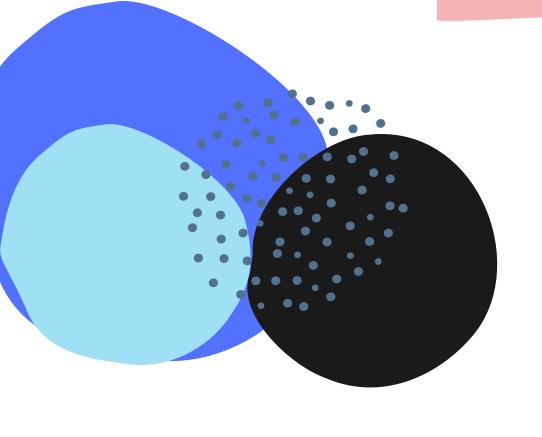
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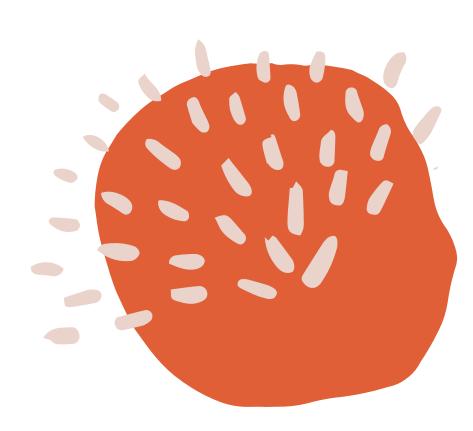

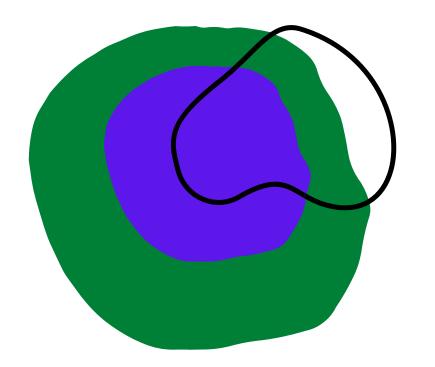

Look at this first to help you get going



READ - about Cofa's Tree and the idea of the City as a growing thing.

LOOK - at the supporting materials in this pack and the short films that go with it.

CHOOSE - one of the six main themes of the event and think about what it means to you.

DRAW - a mind map and start to think about shapes and words that incorporate your chosen theme.

THINK - about a word to incorporate into your design. Why this word? Why not DISCUSS with parents, friends or teachers?

DESIGN - a flag using your chosen word as part of your design on a portrait piece of A4 paper.

RETURN your design to school - don't forget to take a photo or scan of it first!

THE STORY OF COFA AND THE ORIGINS OF COVENTRY



The origin of the beginnings of our great city and its name are derived from a residing belief that over a thousand years ago it was an Anglo-Saxon Village and within that village there lived an elder name Cofa. He was a well-travelled and insightful man full of adventure, stories of his life and the world around him.

It is said that every day the villagers would gather at the Old English Oak tree in the middle of the village to listen to Cofa's stories about the past, his travels and his interpretation of what might become of the future, they thought he was a very wise man with revolutionary thoughts and ideas.

From this, the Oak tree is known as "Cofa's Tree".

This became the foundation and the rooted beginnings of our city.

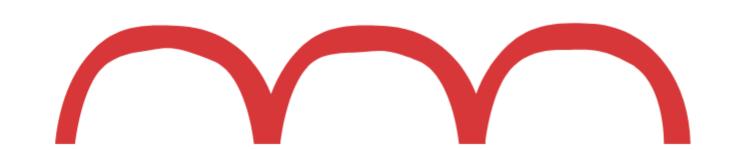
"Cofa's tree" developed into Coventry, from a small village to a vast city built on Resilience, innovation, people power, sustainability, social justice, youthfulness and the spirit of its forefathers.

This is a popular myth of how our city got its name, but there is no hard evidence that this is the case. To grow from a story of a wise man and his tree who connected with his community is profound and a wonderful notion to have a city built on this idea of growth and empowerment.

The idea of Coventry as a growing thing, like a tree, has been part of the planning for the City of Culture.

The tree symbolises our past (the roots), the present (the trunk and branches) but also the future. The canopy will contain your flag design as an abstract idea with representation of your dreams and aspirations entwined in the tree as the future ambassadors of the city.

- What do you like about this story? Think about it. How does it make you feel about this city you live in and how it has grown? what do you like the most?
- If you were Cofa, what stories would you tell your future community about your life in Coventry?
- Ask your family what they think of Coventry and what it means to them. Maybe get them to tell you a story about their life living in this vibrant city.

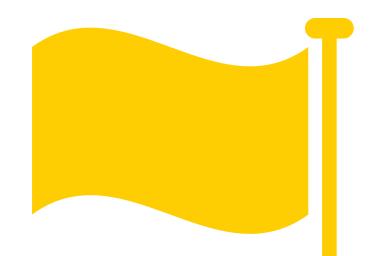




WHY A FLAG?

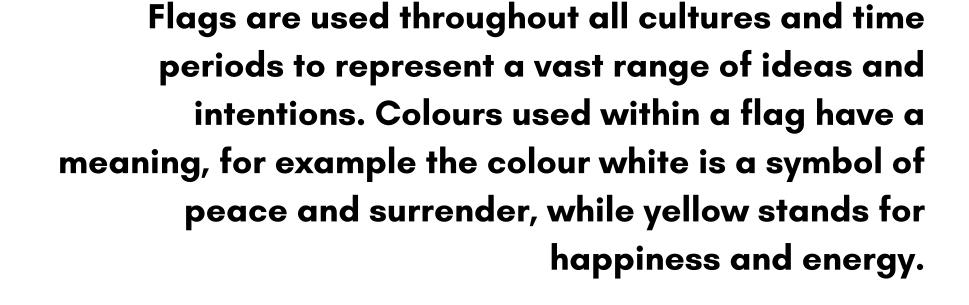
Flags are about identity.

They use blocks of colour and striking designs to tell a story about the place or the people they represent.





A flag is made up of bold block colours, with shapes and symbols conveying a message.





Flags can be used to represent a group that we belong to; a place, like a nation or state; an action like showing your feelings in a protest; support for a team; or as a symbol of love and remembrance. Other flags, such as Tibetan prayer flags, are visual representations of more abstract concepts, designed to encourage meditation.

For this project we would like you to design and make a flag to represent you, your thoughts and feelings and aspirations about living in Coventry, The City of Culture 2021.

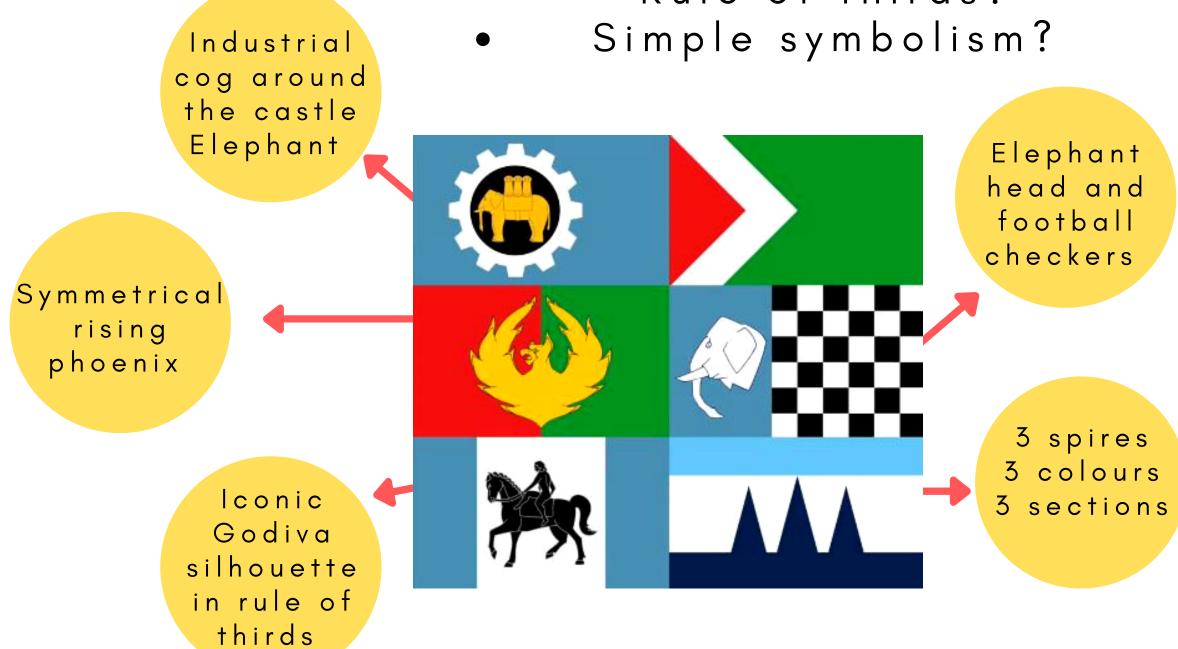
Question:

- Rule of thirds?













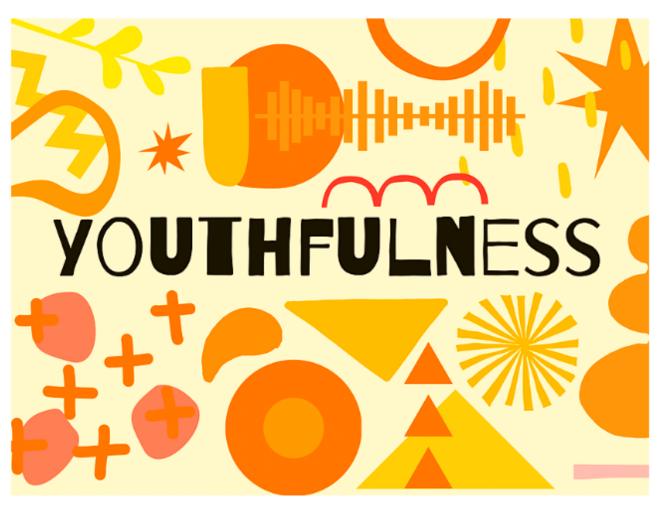

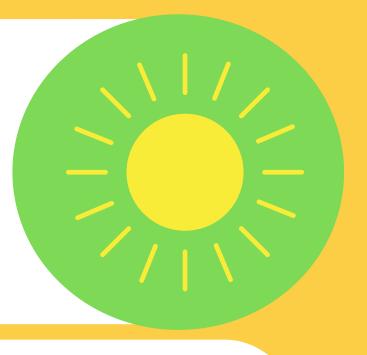


THEMES

THEMES pick one of these themes to explore on your flag design

RESILIENCE

This means how we bounce back from disappointments or deal with hardships – how the city emerged from the hardships of the Second World War and the Blitz; how we will emerge from the challenges of COVID.



SOCIAL JUSTICE

This means people, laws, fairness and equality for everyone. From Black Lives Matter and School Climate Strikes to Housing Associations saving a local street from development, the city has often been a place where people make changes happen.

YOUTHFULNESS

Coventry is a city with more young people than most places in Britain. But this word doesn't just mean 'young'; it means being open to ideas, being energetic, thinking about the future...anyone can be youthful!



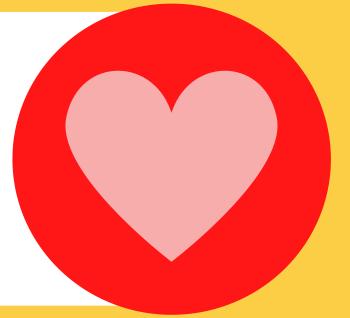


INNOVATION

This means making new, original stuff, and having new, original ideas. From building cars and developing the modern bicycle to Delia Derbyshire and electronic music, Coventry has always been about finding new ways of doing things.

PEOPLE POWER

This means the difference ordinary people can make. From the people who made the Medieval textile industries to the new communities that enrich our culture, the City has always grown through the hard work of its people in all their diversity.



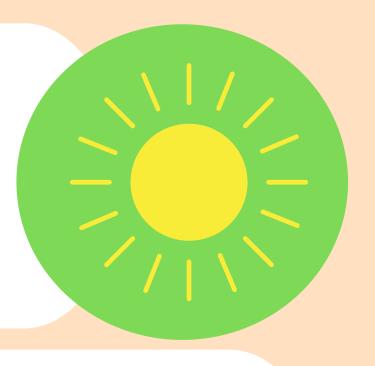


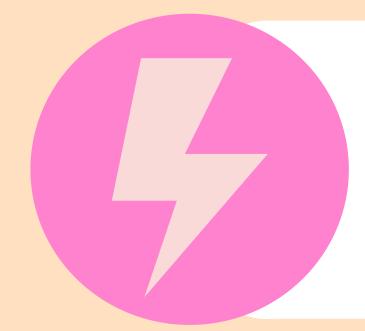
SUSTAINABILITY

This means using the earth's resources in such a way that they will continue to be available in the future. It is fitting that Coventry saw the birth of the Green party; a vision of sustainability will drive the City's future.

RESILIENCE

How has society generally had to demonstrate resilience recently? Can you think of a famous person who has had to show resilience in their life or career? Does showing resilience always mean winning?





SOCIAL JUSTICE

Can you think of a time in your life when you felt that you, or someone you know, was treated unfairly? What did you do to address this, if anything?

YOUTHFULNESS

How can old people be 'youthful?' Do you know an older person who behaves in a 'youthful' way? What makes them 'Youthful'? How can a City be youthful?





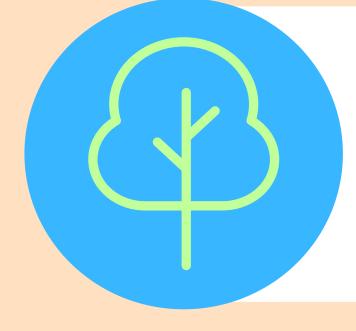
INNOVATION

SUSTAINABILITY

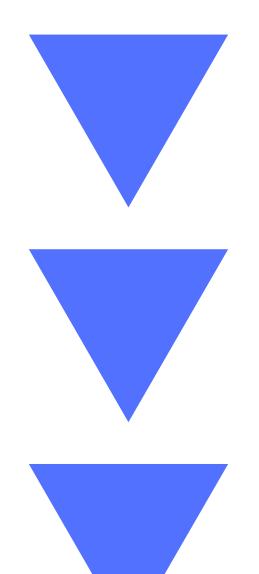
In what ways do the adults around you try and make the world a better place to live in? What are they missing? How would you improve the world for the children of the future?

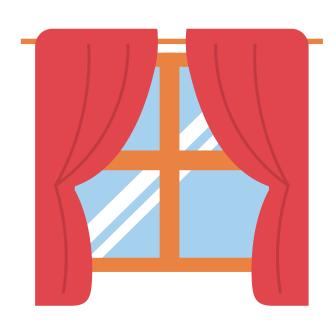
GETTING STARTED...



Perhaps your design could be inspired by the famous artist Henri Matisse? He used paper and "took his scissors for a walk" cutting out all kinds of simple colourful shapes to tell a story in his work. This process, collage, uses paper shapes stuck to a background piece of paper.

Avoid using small details - your flag needs to be simple in its design.

We would like your design made through COLLAGE.

Keep those pesky pens away and step back from the paint. It's all about PAPER!

- A4 plain paper
- Scissors
- Glue

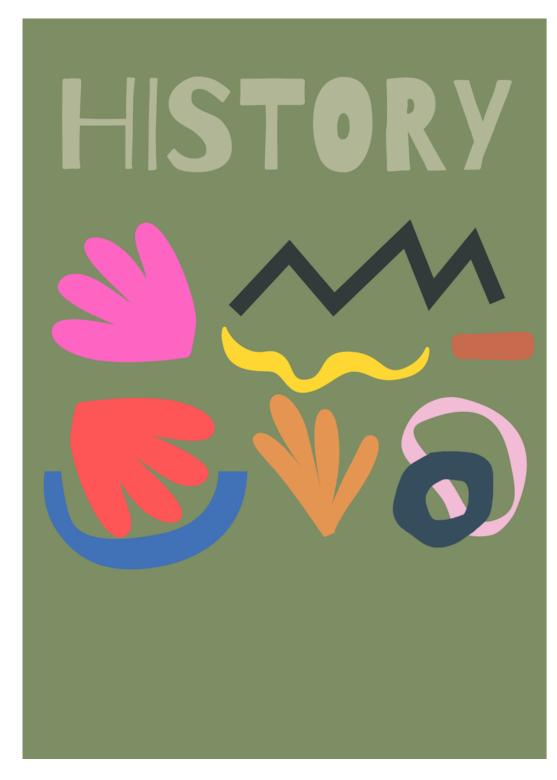

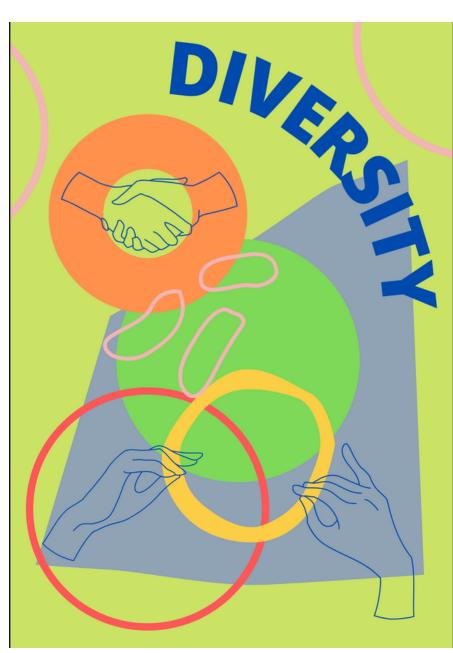

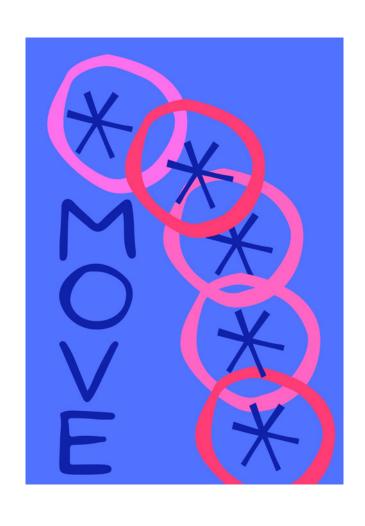
