1. Reception to Year 2 - trophy for the 'WSF <u>Youngest</u> Wildlife Photographer of the Year' (At Warwick Prep School and Kingsley School)

A prize for the best picture of any **wild** living thing! (animals, plants, insects, etc.). No pictures of your pets please!

2. Years 3-6 trophy for the 'WSF <u>Young</u> Wildlife Photographer of the Year' (At Warwick Prep School, Warwick Junior School and Kingsley School)

A prize for the best picture of any **wild** living thing! (animals, plants, insects, etc.). No pictures of your pets please!

3. Years 7-13 trophies for the 'WSF Wildlife Photographer of the Year' in these categories (Years 7-9 or years 10-13 at Warwick Senior School, Kings High School and Kingsley School)

Animal behaviour and Animal Portraits

Revealing the personality of an individual or a group of animals in a thought-provoking or memorable way or a picture revealing active behaviour that adds to our understanding of the nature of a species (not suitable for pet animals, it's a wildlife photography competition!).

Microphotography

Going really small! Close up pictures of nature showing meaning in the smallest of things nature has to offer. This can be something like a tiny seed, an insect or fungi!

4. Years 7-13 trophies for the 'WSF <u>Impactful</u> Wildlife Photographer of the Year' in these categories (Years 7-9 or years 10-13 at Warwick Senior School, Kings High School and Kingsley School)

Photojournalism

Investigating the relationship between humans and the natural world. Images can be challenging, uplifting, provocative or revelatory, and should illustrate how our attitudes, decisions and actions impact the natural world.

Natural Artistry

Reflecting the simple beauty or complex artistry of nature. Images can be in colour or black and white, and although they may not match the criteria of other categories, they must remain true to nature.
